Activities are open to all youth ages 5-18. Workshops are designed for specific age groups. You do not have to be a current 4-H member to participate. Join us for a fun and exciting time!

All Moore County 4-H Summer Fun registrations will open in **4honline** on May 8th and close on June 9th. Registration is first come first serve and spots are limited. Please take advantage of the early registration dates to ensure your child's space in the workshop of their choice.

Participants will receive a Moore County 4-H t-shirt with registration. Payments will be accepted at the Moore County Cooperative Extension Center located at 707 Pinehurst Avenue, Carthage, NC 28327. Total payment is expected prior to the first camp your child will attend. You may pay using cash or check made out to Moore County. Credit and/or debit cards are not accepted. There will be no refunds or exceptions.

Light snacks and water will be provided at each workshop. Participants will need to bring a bag lunch to all events requesting such. All events and field trips will continue rain or shine.

Tri- County Livestock Camp

Date: June 12th-15th **Times:** 8:00am – 5:00pm

Location: 707 Pinehurst Ave., Carthage

Ages: 8-18. **Cost:** \$40

During this 4-day camp youth will travel to farms in Montgomery, Moore, and Randolph counties to learn about livestock production and husbandry practices. Youth will learn care, management, fitting, & showmanship skills during the camp. Youth will learn about poultry, hay production, goat dairy, and beef cattle. *Lunch provided. **Jeans and closed toed shoes are required for all participants.

Cloverbud Nature Camp

"Water Works" Cloverbuds

Date: July 10th **Time:** 9 am -12 pm

Ages: 5-8 **Cost:** \$10

Where does our water come from? How can we protect our waterways? On July 10th, we will explore the main sources of water, why we should value it, and the everyday actions we can do to protect it. Cloverbuds will be able to explain the water cycle and recognize that water is truly essential for life. There will be a live enviroscape demonstration and several hands-on activities that will help participants develop healthy habits that benefit our local waterways and promote sustainable community change.

"Water Works" Junior & Senior

Ages: 9-18 Cost: \$10

Why should we value water? How can individuals be active agents in preventing water pollution? You have the questions, and will explore the solutions. On July 10th, junior and senior participants will explore where their drinking water comes from and how human activities can impact local waters. Through a live enviroscape demonstration and a series of hands-on activities, participants will be able to identify point vs. non-point pollution, understand the importance of riparian buffers, and use critical thinking when it comes to the future of building a society that values water.

Farm to Fork Camp

Cow Hand - Intro to Large Animal Veterinary Science

Campers will learn about the rich history of rodeo and ranching. While exploring the ins and outs of rodeo and ranching, campers will learn about the veterinary science behind raising large animals, cattle, horses, and sheep. Campers will learn the differences between English and Western saddles and how the development of the western saddle has influenced the veterinary science and health care of large animals. This day-long camp will help teach campers the necessary animal handling skills, identifying sick animals, roping, and many more skills needed to be a successful Cow hand. *Lunch provided. **Jeans and closed toed shoes are required for all participants.
